CERTIFICATION ORDER

This matter came on for consideration before the State Labor Relations Board on March 8, 1969.

1. On February 14, 1969, the parties filed with the State Labor Relations Board a Stipulation for a consent election of collective bargaining representative for all permanent, full-time patrolmen of the Police Department of the City of Rutland, presently nineteen (19) in number.

2. On March 3, 1969, an election was held with voting between the hours of ten o'clock a.m. and eleven o'clock a.m. at the City Council Chambers. The election was held under the supervision of William Kemsley, a member of the State Labor Relations Board.

3. The employees of the bargaining unit were asked to vote on the following question:

Do you wish to be represented for exclusive collective bargaining purposes by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO or Rutland Police Benevolent Association or neither.


All of the eligible nineteen patrolmen voted with the results being as follows:

Rutland Police Benevolent Association,	10
American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO,	8
neither,	1

Now therefore it is hereby ORDERED that the Rutland Police Benevolent Association is hereby certified as the exclusive

collective bargaining agent and representative of the bargaining unit consisting of the permanent and full-time patrolmen of the City of Rutland Police Department.
