ORDER

On February 9, 1990, the Winhall Police Officers Association ("Association") filed a Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative, requesting an election among the police officers employed by the Town of Winhall ("Town")

The Town agreed to the conducting of a consent election among the police officers, excluding the chief, employed by the Town Police Department to determine whether they wished to be represented by the Association or no union.

Charles McHugh, Labor Relations Board Chairman, conducted an election on March 30, 1990, in the Meeting Room, Town Hall, Bondville, Vermont. Prior to the time of the election, two employees voted by absentee ballot. At the election, Attorney James O'Neil was present as an observer for the Association, and Theodore Friedman, Chairman of the Town Board of Selectmen, was present as an observer for the Town. In addition to the two employees who voted by absentee ballot, the other two eligible employees voted.

The results of the election were:

Winhall Police Officers Association	2
No Union	2

As a result of this election, it is hereby ORDERED that the Winhall Police Officers Association is NOT CERTIFIED as the exclusive bargaining representative of the police officers, excluding the Chief, employed by the Town of Winhall Police Department.
