CERTIFICATION ORDER

This matter came on for consideration before the State Labor Relations Board on March 18, 1971.

1. The parties filed with the State Labor Relations Board a Stipulation for a Consent Election of exclusive collective bargaining representative for a bargaining unit of the employees of the Street Department of the City of South Burlington, Vermont with the exception of supervisory personnel.

2. On March 17, 1971, an election was held in the City of South Burlington, Vermont under the supervision of William Kemsley, member of the State Labor Relations Board.

3. Nine employees of the City of South Burlington Street Department were eligible to vote and were asked to vote on the following question:


Do you wish to be represented for exclusive collective bargaining purposes by the National Association of Government Employees.

The result of the vote was: Yes, 7; No, 2.


NOW THEREFORE it is hereby ORDERED that the National Association of Government Employees is hereby certified as the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all of the employees of the Street Department of the City of South Burlington, with the exception of supervisory employees.
