## ORDER OF CERTIFICATION

On January 26, 2011, the New England Police Benevolent Association, I.U.P.A., AFL-CIO ("Association") filed a Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative to represent the patrol officers employed by the Village of Waterbury.
