ORDER

On May 2, 2016, the New England Police Benevolent Association (“Association”) filed a Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative to represent all full-time police officers, corporals and sergeants of the Village of Woodstock. The Village of Woodstock (“Employer”) agreed to the conducting of a representation election among these employees.

On June 20, 2016, Labor Relations Board Executive Director Timothy Noonan conducted an election among these employees in the Fire Department Training Room in the Emergency Services Building, 454 Woodstock Road, Woodstock, Vermont. Mary Reilly, Assistant Town Clerk for the Employer, was present as an observer for the Employer. The Association had no observer. All four eligible employees voted. Employees were asked if they wish to be represented for exclusive bargaining purposes by the New England Police Benevolent Association. The results of the election were:
