O R D E R

This matter came on for consideration before the State Labor Relations Board on June 29, 1976.

1. On May 20, 1976, the Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative was filed. An Answer to the Petition was filed by the City of Winooski under date of June 7, 1976. On June 7, 1976, the parties filed a Stipulation agreeing to a consent election to be conducted by the State Labor Relations Board. Said Stipulation further provided for a bargaining unit consisting of the full-time police officers of the City of Winooski excluding the Chief and clerical employees. The parties also stipulated to nine police officers being eligible.

2. On June 29, 1976, Alfred J. Schmitt, a member of the Board, conducted an election by secret ballot. The police officers were asked to vote on the following question:


Do you wish to be represented for exclusive collective bargaining purposes by the International Brotherhood of Police Officers (IBPO)?

Nine police officers were eligible to vote. The result of the vote was, yes, nine; no, zero.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the International Brotherhood of Police Officers is hereby certified as the exclusive collective bargaining representative for the full-time police officers of the City of Winooski excluding the Chief and clerical employees.


