CERTIFICATION ORDER

This matter came on for consideration before the State Labor Relations Board on July 3, 1972.

1. The parties filed with the State Labor Relations Board a Stipulation for a Consent Election of exclusive collective bargaining representative for a bargaining unit of the patrolmen of the police department of the Village of Essex Junction, Vermont.

2. On June 27, 1972, an election was held in the Village of Essex Junction, Vermont, under the supervision of Alfred J. Schmitt, member of the State Labor Relations Board.

3. Six patrolmen of the Village of Essex Junction Police Department were eligible to vote and were asked to vote on the following question:

Do you wish to be represented for exclusive collective bargaining purposes by Local 404 International Brotherhood of Police Officers.

The result of the vote was: Yes, 6; No, 0.

NOW THEREFORE it is hereby ORDERED that the International Brotherhood of Police Officers, Local number 404, is hereby certified as the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all of the patrolmen of the police department of the Village of Essex Junction, Vermont.
