CERTIFICATION ORDER

This matter came on for consideration before the State Labor Relations Board on October 4, 1973.

1. Findings and order were issued by the Board in this matter dated August 16, 1973.

2. Pursuant to said Findings and Order an election was held in St. Johnsbury on September 27, 1973, under the supervision of Alfred J. Schmitt, member of the State Labor Relations Board.

3. Five patrolmen of the Police Department were eligible to vote and three dispatchers. A separate vote was taken by the patrolmen and by the dispatchers who were asked to vote on the following question:

Do you wish to be represented for exclusive collective bargaining purposes by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO.

The result of the vote by the patrolmen was: Yes, 5; No, 0.
The result of the vote by the dispatchers was: Yes, 3; No, 1.

NOW THEREFORE it is hereby ORDERED that the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFL-CIO is hereby certified as the exclusive collective bargaining representative of all the patrolmen and all of the dispatchers of the Police Department of the Town of St. Johnsbury, Vermont.
