ORDER OF CERTIFICATION

On December 14, 1990, Local 1201, AFSCME, AFL-CIO ("Union") filed a Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative, requesting an election among all employees of the Town of Brandon ("Town") Police Department, excluding the Chief of Police and special officers. In a response filed December 31, 1990, the Town raised various questions of unit determination.

Subsequently, the Union and the Town agreed to the conducting of a consent election among all employees of the Town Police Department who have completed their probationary period, excluding the Chief of Police and special officers. Linda McIntire, Board Legal Assistant, conducted an election on March 20, 1991, in a room in Town of Brandon offices, Brandon, Vermont. Ralph Crippen, AFSCME Organizer, observed the election for the Union. Joseph Arduca, Town Police Chief, was Town observer. All four eligible employees voted. The results of the election were:


As a result of this election, it is hereby ORDERED:


