ORDER OF CERTIFICATION

On March 13, 2020, the New England Police Benevolent Association (“Association”) filed a Petition for Election of Collective Bargaining Representative, seeking to represent all full-time police officers, corporals and the administrative supervisor employed by the Village of Woodstock (“Employer”). The Employer filed a response to the petition on April 13, 2020, agreeing to the conducting of a representation election among these employees.

The Labor Relations Board conducted a secret ballot election by mail. Employees were asked if they wished to be represented for exclusive bargaining purposes by the New England Police Benevolent Association. Board Executive Director Timothy Noonan counted the ballots on June 3, 2020, in the Labor Relations Board hearing room, 13 Baldwin Street, Montpelier. Robbie Blish, Police Chief for the Employer, observed the counting of ballots for the Employer via video. The Association had no observer. Three of the five eligible employees voted. The results of the election were:

As a result of this election, it is ordered that the New England Police Benevolent Association is certified as the exclusive bargaining representative of all full-time police officers, corporals and the administrative supervisor employed by the Village of Woodstock.
